***Law 602-3 §001 Legal Globalization and Comparative Law: Australia²** (Dervan): Instructor permission required for enrollment in this course. Travel over winter break.

Law 606-3, §001/§002 for S/U grading ONLY¹, International Criminal Law (Dervan): Course instructions, materials, and content will be delivered online.

Law 609-3, §001 Current Developments in American Law: Oil and Gas Law (Grindstaff): Course instructions, materials, and content will be delivered online.

Law 633-3, §001/§002 for S/U grading ONLY¹, Intellectual Property and Commercialization (Patino): Course instructions, materials, and content will be delivered online via Desire 2 Learn (D2L), accessible to students using SIUC network login and password at <https://online.siu.edu>. Formal class meetings will also be held 6:30 PM – 8:30 PM in Room 104i on the following dates: Sept. 8, Oct. 6, Oct. 27 and Nov. 17.

Law 672-(2-6), §001 Judicial Externship (Mocsary): Open to 2L and 3L students who wish to clerk for a federal or state judge. In lieu of formal class sessions at the School of Law, the course will be taught online. A cumulative GPA of 2.6 is required, except that students with a cumulative GPA below 2.6 may request special authorization from the instructor to enroll in the course.

Law 675-(1-6), §001 Public Interest Externship² (Brittingham): Instructor permission required for enrollment in this course. Open to 2L and 3L students. A cumulative GPA of 2.6 is required. An organizational meeting of the course will be conducted at a date and time to be determined by the instructor.

Law 675-(1-3), §002 Public Interest Externship² — Innocence Project (Nichols Cook): Instructor permission required for enrollment in this course. Open to 2L and 3L students. A cumulative GPA of 2.6 is required. An organizational meeting of the course will be conducted at a date and time to be determined by the instructor. Additional meetings will be scheduled throughout the semester by the instructor.

****Law 675-(1-3), §003 Public Interest Externship² — Prisoner Civil Rights Litigation** (Chapman): Instructor permission required for enrollment in this course. Open to 2L and 3L students. A cumulative GPA of 2.6 is required. An organizational meeting of the course will be conducted at a date and time to be determined by the instructor. Course meets Mondays from 5:00-5:50 pm in Room 164.

Law 691-(6-9), §001 Semester in Practice Externship: Criminal Practice² (Dervan): Students will have the option to enroll in International Criminal Law and/or Sentencing Law for the SIP. SIP students wishing to enroll in Sentencing Law may take it as a synchronous distance learning course. They must enroll in at least one of them. Open to 3L students. A cumulative GPA of 2.6 is required.

The first day of regular classes is Monday, August 22, 2016. The last day of regular classes is Friday, December 2, 2016. Monday, December 5, 2016 is reserved for a reading period. Final exams will be conducted Tuesday, December 6, 2016 through Friday, December 16, 2016.
