**ABA Standards for Approval of Law Schools (Revised Standards)**
**Standard 306. Distance Education**

- A law school shall not grant a student more than total of 15 credit hours toward the J.D. degree for courses qualifying under this Standard.
- A law school shall not enroll a student in courses qualifying for credit under this Standard until that student has completed instruction equivalent to 28 credit hours toward the J.D. degree.
