Course Description

This course examines the constitutional and statutory framework governing the criminal justice process from investigation through trial. Using *Criminal Procedure: Cases and Materials*, 3rd edition, by Cynthia Lee and Song Richardson, students will examine how the Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Amendments shape law enforcement practices, prosecutorial discretion, and defendants' rights. Emphasis will be placed on striking a balance between effective policing and individual liberty and equality under the law.

Course Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

1. Analyze constitutional protections related to search, seizure, interrogation, and counsel.
2. Evaluate Supreme Court precedent shaping criminal justice procedure.
3. Apply criminal procedure doctrines to factual scenarios.
4. Examine the intersection of race, bias, and policing as this relates to building professional identity, bias, cross-cultural competency, and anti-racism.
5. Develop oral advocacy and analytical writing skills through class discussions and exercises.
